Village community centre updates

This month saw a range of essential maintenance and improvements carried out across the village. We had a deep clean of the community centre and pavilion including windows, tiles and carpets being steamed cleaned.

Aesthetic enhancements included repainting the women's bathrooms and disabled toilet, as well as repairing tile grout. Gym equipment was serviced.

All work sheds and community facilities underwent testing and tagging.

Air handling system filters were replaced. The deck leveling repair was completed, with old timber decking swapped out for durable Modwood. A new village flag was proudly set up, adding a fresh touch to our communal identity. For our agua aerobics classes, new pool noodles were provided.



Garden Report by Robert Burza

Over the past four weeks, we have distributed anco lawn feed throughout the entire village, which will promote grass growth and combat weeds. Major tree pruning was also carried out throughout the village. We have also finished weed spraying; small weeds will take about 2-4 weeks to die off, while larger ones may take 4-6 weeks, and a second spray might be necessary. Additionally, we have fertilized the young trees in the village with our six-month fertilizer, Troforte - M. The trimming of the lilly pilly along the fence line has also been completed.


Our next Village Outing is a Guided Tour of the Geelong Gaol

Community Vegetable Garden Update



What a turbulent month mother nature had given us to start spring.

Our Village Garden however has met most challenges of the strong winds and cold weather.

Sadly our lovely garlic crop did succumb to rust disease - and had to be removed .

On the plus side, cabbages, snow peas and leafy greens continue to provide good harvest.

Thank you for the generous donations of lemons, mandarins, walnuts and lots of dwarf sunflower seeds.

This week we are Introducing a new vegetable to some of you is kohirabi.

It is an excellent source of Vitamin C (maintain bone, teeth and cartilage), fiber (beneficial for digestion and prevents constipation), Vitamin B6, (helps immunity), potassium (helps blood pressure) and has multiple antioxidants.

How to Prepare

You can prepare kohlrabi raw in salads or slaws, roast it, or prepare it in soups.

Peel and roast kohlrabi bulbs with garlic, olive oil, and parmesan cheese

Slice kohlrabi bulbs and add raw to a slaw with apples

Add kohlrabi to chicken soup for some extra crunch and body

Puree kohlrabi with onion for a creamy soup base

Boil kohlrabi bulbs and serve in a cream sauce as a side dish with meat or fish

Mash kohlrabi with potatoes for a healthier version of mashed potatoes


Congratulations to this years winners : Nick Lewis, Greg Chalmers , Christine Noble and Phil Griffin, with a winning score of 59.25










Anne Cowden, Retired Celebrant: "Bridesmaids, Brides, Grooms and other Celebratory Experiences"



On Tuesday 10th September 2024, Anne Cowden, Village Resident and Retired Celebrant gave a very entertaining and interesting presentation on the role of Celebrants in officiating at, and facilitating marriages, baby naming ceremonies, commitment ceremonies, funeral services and numerous other ceremonies that people wish to conduct in their lives. She provided background information on when and why the Marriage Celebrant Role was first created as an alternative to Church or Registry Office services and how the role has evolved and expanded to include many different types of celebrations. Her presentation included wonderful examples of the many and varied ways people celebrate important events in their lives such as Scottish bagpipes marching the guests into the wedding venue, delivering the bride to a groom across a swollen river, dress-up ceremonies in Victorian era costumes, painted and decorated coffins of family members, to name just a few.

Interestingly, in question time there were few questions about weddings and a lot more on funerals! A take home message from Anne was write down what you want from a celebration and how you want it to be conducted! Don't leave it to the family to squabble over what kind of music should be played at Dad's funeral.

Anne's delightful presentation offered many insights and observations about the way people behave in ceremonies. The 30 residents who attended were a very happy bunch at the end of the session. Particularly as Anne's closing piece of very practical advice was you don't need Bridesmaids for a Funeral!!!!
