### Village community centre updates

This month saw a range of essential maintenance and improvements carried out across the village. Acquisition of two defibrillators for our village emergency responders to carry with them. Installation of additional outdoor seating in Stage 7a Wetlands.

We upgraded the library with new mailboxes and shelving. Thank you for your understanding during the brief closure of the library. The new mailboxes can now accommodate magazines, and the new library table looks great, providing ample space for all the parcels for our eager shoppers—just in time for Christmas.

### Garden Report by Robert Burza

Over the course of the month, the following tasks will be accomplished: The community centre will receive an aerator scarifier, which will cause the lawns to turn brown temporarily. Afterward, they will be nourished and watered, and within 4-6 weeks, they will return to a lush green state. The gardening team is currently operating on a temporary schedule: Frank will oversee stages 1-3, Robert will handle stages 4, 5, 6, and 7a, while Nathan will take care of stages 7b, 8, 9, and 10. Stage 2 will be managed by all the team.

### **Emergency Pendant Information Session**

This session is perfect for new residents or anyone seeking a refresher on the benefits of the pendant. Join us on Wednesday, the 13th, at 10:30 AM in the boardroom.

This pendant alarm system is specifically designed for seniors and features the ability to alert emergency responders, provide two-way voice communication, and pinpoint the resident's location.



Also very nice to have many residents come up for a visit and a chat. Maria R







The other end of the pendulum for Marvin comes with The Professionals. Not a conventional "cowboy" western as it is set in the early part of the twentieth century.


Terrific stars with Lee Marvin, Burt Lancaster, Robert Ryan, Woody Strode, Jack Palance and Claudia Cardinale.

## Denis O'Reilly, Historian, Queenscliffe Historical Society: The Life and Times of William Buckley





On Tuesday 8th October 2024, Denis O'Reilly, ably assisted with the audio-visual equipment by his son Declan gave a fascinating presentation on the experiences of William Buckley an escaped convict who managed to remain alive with assistance of the aboriginal tribes of the Bellarine Peninsula.


Denis dressed in convict clothing and spoke in the first person as William Buckley might have told his story. William Buckley, described as a "giant of a man" became accepted by aboriginal people because they believed he was the re-incarnation of a recently killed aboriginal man. After more than 30 years living with the Wathaurung people and having

lost all vestige of English language he gave himself up to a camp left by John Batman at Indented Head in 1835.



William Buckley's life and adventures were recorded in a book first published in 1852 and reprinted as a Text Classic in 2022. The book gives real insight into the hardship, struggles and challenges he endured. Denis has kindly donated a copy of this book for the Bellarine Springs Village Library.

### **Drysdale Food Bank Drive 2024**

As the supermarkets and shopping malls love to remind us, Christmas is coming. This time of year, many of us appreciate how fortunate we are to have the security of a roof over our head and food on the table and we recognise that others in our Drysdale and Clifton Springs community are not so fortunate.

For this reason, Geoff Turner and I have organised an easy way for residents to contribute food items for our local foodbank every November.

**About the foodbank**: The Drysdale food bank is run as part of Drysdale Family Support (DFS), out of the Drysdale Community Church. The DFS also operates a counselling centre and second chance shops. The food bank receives some funding from Give Where You Live grants, but it has seen an increase in demand in recent years and always appreciates extra donations around this time of year.

**How it works, in-kind donations**: On Monday 25th November residents leave their donations of canned and packaged food, toiletries, cleaning products, etc. (no frozen goods please), on their porch by 10am. Geoff and I, along with some helpers from the village then drive around collecting the items and we deliver them to the foodbank on Jetty Road that day.

If that time is not convenient for you, you can leave your donation on my porch after November 20th.
