Village Updates

Monthly inspections were carried out by fire service contractors.

The water filters for both Billi taps at the community center and the Zip hot water tap in the Pavilion were replaced. We invested in multi-tools for key areas, including the bowling green, tennis courts, and lawns.

The hot water service for the community center was repaired, which included the installation of a new set of spark and sensor leads, as well as a gasket.

A comprehensive servicing of the system was completed, and grease trap maintenance was also performed. We updated the pathway on community drive to the stage 10.

We have also installed a new handrail for the bowling green stairs.


Peter's presentation took us down a very different path — after many years in the Policeforce, he left to establish BioClean.

This company provided clean up services dealing with the human and physical messes created by criminal

drug makers producing amphetamines in kitchens and lounge rooms. Peter showed pictures of these houses illustrating how catastrophic the damage can become. The strategies and methods used for cleaning up include toxic chemicals requiring whole body protection, masks and specialised breathing equipment. The type and intensity of chemicals needed ultimately determines whether the premises can be salvaged or whether the premises are beyond recovery and are designated as unfit for human habitation. This was an eye opening and shocking presentation and the group were mightily impressed by the dangerous work Peter Guerin and his associates undertake.

Although the session went well over the scheduled time those attending were initially fascinated by Jaynes stories and then gob-smacked by the horrible situations Peter had to manage!

Frog Heaven

FrogID is an Australian Museum citizen science project, and November 8–17 was 'Frog Week', so we recorded and submitted the wonderful frog chorus at the dam on Saratoga Circuit.

The calls were confirmed as being those of the Common Eastern Froglet (sounds like a cricket chirping, with three to five repeats; "crick crick crick"), the Brown Tree Frog (a series of rapid, harsh, whirring pulsing notes repeated 5—15 times, the first note usually the longest -"creeeeeee creee creee cree cree cree") and the Spotted Marsh Frog (a short, sharp "click" or "plock" regularly repeated, like two stones being struck together). Enjoy the lullaby!

Thank you to everyone who contributed to this year's collection.

This is the fifth year that Geoff and I have run this drive, which allows Village residents to make in-kind donations from their doorstep, and once again all items were gratefully received. A Certificate of Appreciation from the Foodbank is on display on the Library Noticeboard until the end of the year.

This year Geoff and I had the privilege of assisting with unpacking your gifts at the centre and stocking the shelves with them. It was very gratifying to see the empty shelves fill up and then overflow, with extra items going into storage cupboards for next week.

Clients come to the Foodbank every Tuesday, usually once a fortnight but sometimes every week. The coordinator told us that demand has never been so high, with 50 families receiving support in each of the last two weeks, and 2 more families registering on our collection day. So, rest assured that your donations are distributed both quickly and locally. Thank you to our collectors, Barb and Alan (who also helped with the unpacking and shelving), Graeme, Steve, and Ross.
